A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 21-155 AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER, DURING THE YEAR 2022, TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS OR TO UTILIZE THE VARIOUS CHARTER AUTHORIZED GOVERNMENTAL COMPETITIVE PURCHASING AND ENTER INTO CONTRACTS FOR CONSTRUCTION MATERIALS, SUPPLIES, EQUIPMENT, AND VEHICLES IN ORDER TO PURCHASE ROAD SALT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson, as a member of the Community University and Education ("C.U.E.") purchasing program, purchases road salt under the C.U.E.'s public bidding procedures pursuant to provisions of Charter Section 6.04 and state law, which allow for the use of cooperative purchasing programs;

WHEREAS, the Public Works Department needs additional road salt supply for snow and ice control for the remainder of the 2021-2022 winter season at a price exceeding the amount authorized in Resolution No. 21-155;

WHEREAS, purchasing of road salt is through the C.U.E. program from Cargill Incorporated of North Olmstead, Ohio, for the 2021-2022 winter season.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to purchase additional road salt at the price of \$59.17 per ton for a total purchase not to exceed \$321,000 for the remainder 2021-2022 winter season.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the City of Hudson and the motorists using City streets and roads this winter season, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
