A RESOLUTION APPROVING AN AMENDMENT TO THE SUMMIT COUNTY 9-1-1 PLAN TO INCLUDE THE SOUTHWEST SUMMIT COUNCIL OF GOVERNMENTS AS A PUBLIC SAFETY ANSWERING POINT, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Barberton, City of Norton and Copley Township have formed the Southwest Summit Council of Governments ("SWSCOG") to consolidate into one public safety answering point ("PSAP"); and

WHEREAS, Section 5507.12 of the Ohio Revised Code requires the Summit County 9-1-1 Planning Committee to consider the addition of the SWSCOG PSAP as an amendment to the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan and to consider recommending the same; and

WHEREAS, on May 29, 2013, the Summit County 9-1-1 Planning Committee met and approved by unanimous vote a recommendation to add the SWSCOG PSAP by amendment to the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 5508.09 and 5507.12 of the Ohio Revised Code, the legislative authority of each municipality in the County and the board of trustees of each township whose territory is included in the countywide 9-1-1 system must approve or disapprove any amendment to the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan will be amended to include the SWSCOG PSAP upon the approval of municipalities and townships that contain sixty (60) percent of the County's population; and

WHEREAS, this Council finds and determines, after reviewing all pertinent information, that it is necessary, and in the best interest of the City of Hudson, to approve the aforementioned amendment to the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: This Council hereby approves the amendment to the Summit County 9-1-1 Plan, recommended by the Summit County 9-1-1 Planning Committee, to add the Southwest Summit Council of Governments as a public safety answering point.

Section 2: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of the County of Summit and to immediately approve the aforementioned amendment to timely comply with the timeframes set forth in Section 5507.08 of the Ohio Revised Code; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto or six affirmative votes if all members of
