

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A PURCHASE AGREEMENT FOR AN AERIAL TRUCK CAB AND CHASSIS FOR HUDSON PUBLIC POWER; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson may purchase vehicles and equipment through the State of Ohio Procurement State Term Contract; and

WHEREAS, the City has obtained a price from Valley Freightliner in Parma, OH, under the State of Ohio Procurement State Term Schedule Contract No. STS-515-7751501309 for an aerial truck cab and chassis for Hudson Public Power in the amount of \$67,100.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1: The City Manager is authorized and directed to enter into and execute on behalf of the City of Hudson a purchase agreement with Valley Freightliner, 10901 Brookpark Road, Parma, OH 44130, for one 50-foot aerial bucket truck cab and chassis for a total amount not to exceed \$67,100, which purchase was approved in the 2014 City Budget.

Section 2: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to make this purchase to continue to provide uninterrupted electric service to the homes and businesses in the City and to take advantage of certain cost savings; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council elected thereto or six affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
