OFFERED BY: MAYOR CURRIN

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS FOR THE 2016 CAPITAL MAINTENANCE PROGRAMS OF THE CITY OF HUDSON; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, certain streets and public properties in the City of Hudson, Ohio, require routine maintenance in order to preserve and protect them and the City has initiatives for sidewalk connectivity.

NOW, THEREFORE, Be It Resolved by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

- Section 1. The City Manager is authorized and directed to advertise for a period of at least once a week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality, requesting the submission of bids for the routine maintenance and repair of various streets and public properties and sidewalk connectivity projects in the City of Hudson, Ohio, to include the 2016 annual reconstruction/resurfacing program, the annual concrete replacement program, the annual asphalt crack sealing program, the annual striping and painting program, and sidewalk connectivity projects in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's Office.
- Section 2. The City Manager is further authorized and directed to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders.
- <u>Section 3</u>. The Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any committees that resulted in those formal actions were in meetings open to the public in compliance with the law.
- Section 4. This Resolution is an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that it is necessary to complete the competitive bidding process for the subject work that is critical to maintaining public safety and to do so at the earliest possible time so as to obtain the most advantageous competitive bids and to complete the work in the 2016 construction season; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
