A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH SCHIRMER CONSTRUCTION FOR PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS FOR THE SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL PROGRAM (PID 93606); AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City is a recipient of federal funds for the Safe Routes to School ("SRTS") Program administered through the Ohio Department of Transportation and has solicited competitive bids for the construction of public improvements related to that Program, including the installation of new electronic school crossing signals on N. Hayden Parkway near Evamere, Eastwood and McDowell Schools; sidewalk installation along Glen Echo Drive from Hudson-Aurora Road to Victoria Parkway; a new crosswalk with ADA-compliant ramps and sidewalk installation on Middleton Road from Winterberry Drive to Ellsworth School; and new bike racks to be purchased and located on school properties (collectively, the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, Schirmer Construction has been determined to be the lowest and best bid for the aforesaid Project;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1</u>: The City Manager is authorized and directed to enter into a contract with Schirmer Construction for the Project in an amount not to exceed \$263,934.33, which includes a contingency amount of \$23,994.03, and the City's contribution to the contract amount shall not exceed \$53,934.33.

<u>Section 2</u>: The Director of Finance is authorized and directed to appropriate to a proper account the funds necessary for the contract authorized in Section 1 of this Resolution.

Section 3: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary for these important public improvement projects to be completed at the earliest possible time so as to provide safe travel to and from school facilities in the City and to complete the work within this construction season; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
