

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER A CONTRACT FOR THE PURCHASE OF ONE FLEET VEHICLE FOR POLICE OPERATIONS.

WHEREAS, the City of Hudson maintains a fleet of vehicles to support police operations and ensure the safety and well-being of the community; and

WHEREAS, it has been determined that one (1) police fleet vehicle is due for replacement as part of the City's regular vehicle replacement program; and

WHEREAS, the City has allocated funds in the approved budget for the acquisition of this vehicle and has identified a vendor able to provide the necessary equipment at a competitive price through a state purchasing program or other authorized procurement method; and

WHEREAS, the pricing for this replacement vehicle falls under Ohio State Contract RS1023078 (New, Model Year 2025 or Manufacturer's Current Production Model - Law Enforcement vehicles), which was awarded to Montrose Ford Inc. to supply the state of Ohio and political subdivisions with 2025 Ford Police Interceptor Utility vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Council finds that it is in the best interest of the City to authorize the City Manager to enter into a contract for the purchase of the replacement police fleet vehicle at the stated cost of \$46,774.00.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract, in a form approved by the City Solicitor, for the purchase of one (1) fleet vehicle to be used for police operations from Montrose Ford Inc.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. That this Council hereby finds and determines that all formal actions relative to the adoption of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council which resulted in formal action were taken in meetings open to the public, in full compliance with the applicable legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
