

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING A HUDSON CITY FLAG; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, Hudson City Council has discussed and reviewed several possible adaptations of a new City of Hudson Flag; and

WHEREAS, from these discussions, City staff began working with Kent State University to help develop several renditions of a potential flag design depicting and honoring the Hudson community; and

WHEREAS, City Council reviewed three final options at its April 26, 2024 meeting; and

WHEREAS, considering the comments and recommendations of City Council, Mayor Anzevino, and representatives from Kent State University, one final design has been selected.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City of Hudson’s official flag shall be the design set forth in Exhibit “A,” attached hereto and incorporated herein.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Ordinance.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Ordinance is hereby declared an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of City residents, the timely establishment of the flag’s design, and shall, therefore, take effect and be in force from and immediately after its passage.
