Executive Summary: The selected consultant will develop the plans and specifications for the Barlow Road Improvement Project. The limits of the project are Barlow Road from Terex Road to SR 91 (Darrow Road). The project's scope includes widening of the existing pavement, a multiuse path, re-grading of the ditches and storm sewer improvements. The Barlow Road grades near the rail crossing will also be improved. The design will strive to minimize the impacts to adjacent properties. Lighting at the intersections and improved signing and pavement markings are included. The Barlow Road and Terex Road intersection will be studied for short and long term solutions including realignment and signal options. The selected short term solution for intersection and the connection from west terminus of the project to connect a multi-use path to the Metro Parks Hike and Bike trail will be developed. The signal at Barlow and SR 91 may be upgraded as part of this project.
