Executive Summary: The Public Properties Division currently contracts for preventative maintenance services and repairs of HVAC equipment and associated control systems assets within public buildings. Public Works staff opened bids on 8/31/17 and the lowest bid was submitted by Gardiner Service Company for a total estimate of \$46,900.00 annually. This is a three (3) year contract with an optional renewal of two (2) years. The current contract expires on December 31, 2017.
