RE: April 2015 Financial Report

Attached are the April month end financial reports. The reports include the following:

1. A Statement of Cash from Revenue and Expense
2. An Executive Summary of the City's major funds: including the General Fund, Street M&R (Service), Cemetery, Parks, Cable TV, Fire, Emergency Medical Services, Water, Wastewater, Electric, Storm Water, Golf Course and Fleet Maintenance Funds. This report shows variance ratios of year-to-date revenues and expenditures compared to previous year-to-date and current budget figures.
3. Bank Report has been included to summarize the investment instruments on which the City earns interest income.
4. Variance Notes have been included to highlight variations from budget projections listed on the Executive Summary.
5. Utility Billing Delinquency Report has been included to show the past due balance totals for our utility customers along with the balances that have been turned over to collections and certified to Summit County and placed as a lien on the property. Also included is the balances written off due to bankruptcy, collection company fees and smaller, immaterial amounts.
6. Bank Reconciliation has been included to show the City's accounts and related reconciling items.

Note: As requested, at the bottom of the Utility Billing Delinquency Report, we added the year to date amount received from the collection companies. We currently use Babcock & Wasserman Co, LPA as our collection agency at a discounted rate of 18%.

REVENUE:

2014 Year-To-Date (YTD) vs. 2015 YTD Actual

Income Tax revenues are \$155,000 higher in 2015 and \$67,000 above estimate. Through the end of April 2015, Withholding taxes are up 6.6%, Individual taxes are up 9.2% and Net Profit taxes are down 26.6%. Including Parks, Fire, EMS and Hudson Schools, income taxes are up \$220,000 or 3.7%. The decrease in Net Profits taxes are due in part to \$100,000 in refunds issued in 2015.

Estate Taxes are \$322,000 lower in 2015 due to the elimination of the tax.

Transfers, Advances and Reimbursements are \$52,000 lower in 2015 primarily due to advances back to the General Fund from Cable TV (\$30,000) in 2014.

Parks and *EMS* revenue is higher due to increased income tax revenue. EMS ambulance billing is also up \$8,400 over 2014. *Fire's* increase in income tax revenue for 2015 is offset by \$20,000 grant revenue in 2014.

EXPENDITURES:

2014 YTD Actual vs. 2015 YTD Actual

General Fund expenditures decreased \$228,000 through April 2015 as compared to April 2014. The largest decrease was \$136,000 in the **Police Department** due to \$164,000 purchases of radio and computer equipment in 2014. **Community Development** expenditures increased \$38,000 primarily due to payments for the Comp Plan update and software upgrades. **Economic Development** is included in the General Fund budget rather than a separate fund. Through April 2015, we have spent \$65,000 vs. \$69,000 through April 2014. **Street Trees and ROW** increased due to tree trimming and ash borer removal payments in 2015. **Administration** decreased \$86,000 primarily due to \$90,000 in tax incentive payments in March 2014. **Transfers and Advances Out** decreased \$107,000 due to reduced debt service and Sewer Fund transfers.

Street Maintenance & Repair expenditures are \$194,000 lower in 2015 primarily due to \$163,000 decrease in road salt payments vs. 2014.

Parks expenditures are \$63,000 higher in 2015 due to \$74,000 in playground equipment purchases in 2015.

Cable TV Fund expenditures are \$48,000 lower in 2015 due the \$30,000 advance back to the General Fund and \$8,900 in payments for control room equipment purchases in 2014.

EMS Fund expenditures are \$73,000 higher in 2014 due the \$27,000 in computer equipment replacements and severance pay in 2014.

Water Fund expenditures are \$117,000 higher in 2015 primarily due to \$169,000 in expenditures for the Division St water line project in 2015.

Electric Fund expenditures are \$1,672,000 lower in 2015 due to the timing of \$1,076,000 payment of our purchase of power. The April 2015 invoice was not due until May 2015. After considering the timing difference, there is a \$628,000 decreased cost of purchased power. The impact of the decreased cost is typically reflected in the decrease in Electric Fund revenue as the cost of power is passed on to customers. We would have anticipated a larger decrease in Electric revenue however there is a lag time between the purchase of power and the resulting impact on revenue. We will monitor this to see if it normalizes over the next month or so.

Fleet Fund expenditures are \$112,000 lower in 2015 primarily due to \$122,000 in decreased payments for vehicles in 2015 vs. 2014. In addition, there was a \$21,000 (17%) in YTD 2015 reduced fuel expenditures due in part from the dramatic drop in gas prices from a year ago.

2015 YTD Actual vs. 2015 Budget

Revenues are generally within a reasonable variance range. Income taxes went from flat last month to 3.7% year over year increase putting us over the 2% projected increase. General Fund Miscellaneous revenue was \$40,000 over estimate due to the \$47,000 grant from the Summit County land bank in 2015. The **Electric Fund** revenue is \$241,000 above estimate due to higher than projected customer sales. **Street Maintenance and Repair Fund** is \$240,000 over estimated due to the increased cost of snow and ice control from the severe winter weather. The **Electric Fund** expenditures are \$1,746,000 below estimate due to timing issues discussed above. Several other funds are lower than estimate for expenses but this will normalize as we move through the year and vacancies are filled and/or budgeted capital items are expensed.
