

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A COLLECTIVE BARGAINING AGREEMENT WITH THE OHIO PATROLMEN'S BENEVOLENT ASSOCIATION FOR DISPATCHERS, FOR THE YEARS 2015 THROUGH 2017; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City, by and through its City Manager's Office and special labor counsel, has negotiated a collective bargaining agreement with representatives of the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association on behalf of dispatcher bargaining unit members in City employment, covering calendar years 2015 through 2017; and

WHEREAS, this Council desires to authorize the City Manager to execute the agreement on behalf of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. This Council approves the terms and conditions of the proposed collective bargaining agreement with Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (Dispatchers), on file with the Clerk of Council and made a part of this Resolution as if fully incorporated herein, and the City Manager is authorized and directed to execute and enter into said agreement with the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (Dispatchers), effective January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2017, on behalf of the City of Hudson.

Section 2. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action, were in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 3. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health safety and welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to authorize an agreement for employment conditions for members of the Ohio Patrolmen's Benevolent Association (Dispatchers), as the same affects the day-to-day operations of the City, and particularly its safety forces; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
