OFFERED BY: MAYOR CURRIN

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO SUBMIT A GRANT APPLICATION TO THE OHIO ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY FOR DIESEL EMISSION REDUCTION; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency provides grant funding on an 80/20 matching basis to reimburse eligible costs of replacing fleet vehicles with newer vehicles that meet higher emissions standards; and

WHEREAS, the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency could provide matching 80/20 grant funding of up to \$237,000 towards the replacement of two snow plow and mud trucks, with the condition that the trucks being replaced will be taken out of service and scrapped.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit and State of Ohio, that:

<u>Section 1:</u> The City Manager is authorized to apply for an 80/20 matching grant to the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency for the reason set forth in the recitals to this Resolution.

Section 2: This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the general welfare of the City and its residents for the reason that it is necessary to apply for this grant without delay to enhance the possibility of receiving the same; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
