TITLE: APPLICATION FOR FEDERAL STP FUNDS AND RESURFACING FUNDS

<u>SECTION 1</u>. The City Manager is authorized to apply for federal Surface Transportation Program ("STP") Funds and Resurfacing Program Funds programmed by the Akron Metropolitan Area Transportation Study ("AMATS") for the following STP Projects:

SECTION 2. The City of Hudson acknowledges and understands the AMATS "Funding Policy Guidelines" and confirms to the best of its knowledge that the information contained in the project applications is accurate, that it intends to diligently pursue that project, and that a local share is required to match federal funds.

SECTION 3. It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of the Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Resolution were taken in an open meeting of this Council and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were meeting open to the public and in compliance with the law.

SECTION 4. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety convenience and welfare of the City of Hudson and the inhabitants thereof, for the reason that it is to apply for this funding within the next 5 days; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be
