

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ISSUE A REQUEST FOR QUALIFICATIONS FOR PROFESSIONAL SERVICES ASSOCIATED WITH THE DESIGN AND CONSTRUCTION OF A CITY PUBLIC WORKS FACILITY; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the City’s public works operations provide a very diverse spectrum of City services that require a large amount of space and land to operate effectively and efficiently; and

WHEREAS, consultants and staff have recommended that a public works facility be sited on approximately 15 acres on the southeastern portion of the former Youth Development Center property on Hines Hill Road; and

WHEREAS, the City is seeking a firm or firms that will be responsible for the design and construction of a City public works facility.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to issue a request for qualifications for professional services associated with the design and construction of a City public works facility.

Section 2. This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that the request for qualifications must be issued as soon as possible for the project to commence and be completed within a reasonable period of time and as contemplated by this Council; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council or six (6) affirmative votes if all members of Council are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
