A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A NEW AGREEMENT WITH RICOH USA, INC. FOR THE LEASING OF MULTIFUNCTION EQUIPMENT FOR THE PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT AND TO TERMINATE AGREEMENTS WITH COMDOC AND MT TECHNOLOGIES UPON TERM EXPIRATIONS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, staff has studied the feasibility of consolidating multifunction equipment within the Public Works Department; and

WHEREAS, staff has recommended termination of agreements with ComDoc and MT Technologies upon the expiration of their terms in 2017 and 2018, and has also recommended entering into a new five-year lease agreement with Ricoh USA, Inc. for a contract period from March 1, 2017, through February 28, 2022, at an annual cost of \$2,994.00; and

WHEREAS, there is an urgent need to improve upon the multifunction equipment being supplied under the current agreements in terms of its operating efficiency, and the City can do so under the proposed agreement at a lower annual cost based upon proposals received by the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio that:

<u>Section 1</u>. The City Manager is authorized to terminate agreements with ComDoc and MT Technologies for multifunction equipment for the Public Works Department upon the expiration of their terms in 2017 and 2018, and to enter into a new agreement with Ricoh USA, Inc. for the leasing of multifunction equipment for \$2,994.00 per year to be used at the Public Works Department for a term from March 1, 2017, through February 28, 2022.

Section 2. This Resolution is determined to be an emergency measure immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, safety and general welfare of the citizens of the City of Hudson by reason of the necessity to timely terminate the existing multifunction equipment leases and to have in place less costly and more effective equipment to serve municipal purposes and the public; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
