# A. <u>17-92</u> A RESOLUTION NOTIFYING THE COUNTY OF SUMMIT OF THE CITY OF HUDSON'S TERMINATION OF THE AGREEMENT OF COOPERATION COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY. <u>Executive Summary:</u> Mr. Kelemen has offered this Resolution to terminate the City's participation in Summit County's CDBG Program. Summit County officials from the Department of Community and Economic Development, including Connie Krauss, Director, and Holly Miller, Senior Administrator, will be present at the June 13, 2017, special Council meeting to discuss the current agreement.

Ms. Krauss and Ms. Miller from Summit County Community and Economic Development Department presented information regarding the Community Development Block Grant Program. They said that CDBG funds can be used for the following: low to moderate income areas, senior citizens over the age of 60, battered spouses, developmentally challenged individuals, communities to allow ADA accessibility, weatherization, and lead abatement. They also clarified that if the City withdraws from the CDBG Program that individual Hudson residents will not be eligible for funds either, and that the "Barriers to Affordable Housing" clause stated in the agreement is a reference to Fair Housing Law, a Federal Law, that Hudson must follow.

Mayor Basil read the title of Resolution No. 17-92, which constituted its second reading.

At the conclusion of the special meeting, Mayor Basil turned the workshop over to Mr. DeSassure at 7:31 p.m.
