

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE VALLEY VIEW ROAD CULVERT REPLACEMENT PROJECT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, it is necessary to remove and replace an existing box culvert that is located within the City's right-of-way near 7855 and 7873 Valley View Road, because it is failing under the roadway and causing settlement of the pavement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of Hudson, Summit County, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to advertise for a period of at least two consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality, requesting the submission of bids for the removal and replacement of an existing box culvert located within the right-of-way near 7855 and 7873 Valley View Road in Hudson in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's office.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract for the removal and replacement of an existing box culvert located within the right-of-way near 7855 and 7873 Valley View Road in Hudson, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid shall not exceed \$90,000, the amount budgeted for this project.

Section 3. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject any and all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.

Section 4. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 5. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and general welfare and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to perform this work as soon as possible to provide safe roadways for the motoring public; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in effect immediately upon its passage

provided it receives the affirmative vote of five members of Council, except that six affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present; otherwise, it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
