1. Call to Order

President of Council DeSaussure called to order the workshop meeting of Hudson City Council at 7:30 p.m.

A. 15-0043 Proclamation: Special Recognition of "A Buck for Ubumi Week"

Executive Summary: In 2009, at the request of Hudson's school children, City Council passed a Resolution to formally adopt the Ubumi Transit Home, an orphanage in Kitwe, Zambia. Dr. Penny Frese will be present to accept this Proclamation.

Dr. Penny Frese accepted the Proclamation on behalf of the Children of Ubumi and Ubumi, Africa and she thanked Mayor Currin, Hudson Residents, Hudson City Schools, and Council for their support. Mr. DeSaussure expressed his concerns regarding the removal of the utility easement intended for the distribution line.

Mr. Richardson stated that he spoke with Mr. Powell in the Public Works Department, and the lines have been installed in the right-of-way, therefore, the utility easement is no longer needed.

Mr. Kelemen had a concern about including fitness trails in future developments and if there would be a need to include these along with a maintenance agreement to ensure these items are maintained. Mr. DeSaussure stated that the Hudson Industrial Development Agreement was approved prior to the adoption of the Land Development Code and these items are now addressed in the LDC.
