2. Correspondence and Council Comments

Mr. Smith read an e-mail he received from an Andover Way resident regarding a recent break-in at her home that happened during the day between 12:00 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. He wanted to make residents aware that this is one of numerous daytime break-ins in the area within the last couple of months and asked that residents take extra precautions.

A. 15-110 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PURCHASE A TRUCK THROUGH THE COMMUNITY, UNIVERSITY & EDUCATION PURCHASING ASSOCIATION (C.U.E.) PROGRAM FOR PARKS DEPARTMENT OPERATIONS.

Executive Summary: As part of the approved 2015 fleet capital replacement budget, the Parks Department has obtained CUE government program pricing for the purchase of one (1) fleet replacement vehicle and wishes to secure pricing and place the vehicle order.

A. TMP-1420 Discussion: City of Hudson Water System Ranking

Executive Summary: The City Staff has created a Draft Ranking of the City's Water Distribution System in an effort to identify the worst condition water mains in need of replacement.
