Ordinance No. 16-114

Mayor Basil called to order the public hearing for Ordinance No. 16-114 at 7:33 p.m. There being no comments from the public or Council members, Mayor Basil closed the public hearing at 7:34 p.m.

A public hearing was held regarding Ordinance No. 16-114.

6. Public Comments

Mr. Sklyar Sutton, 2243 Ravenna Street, spoke in opposition to Ordinance No. 16-112, entitled "An Ordinance to Submit to the Electors of the City of Hudson the Question of Amending the Charter at Article VI, Section 6.02, to Revise the Income Tax Credit for City Residents Who Pay Income Tax to Another Municipality or Joint Economic Development District; and Declaring an Emergency." Although he was against a modification to municipal income taxes, he said that if Council decides to move forward, the issue deserves to be on the November 2016 ballot.

Mr. Mike Popovich, 4388 Westchester Court, spoke regarding ongoing issues concerning his neighbor's property, including general upkeep, trash, and dead trees. He complained that the dead trees are a safety hazard, and he asked for the City's assistance. Mayor Basil said that someone from the City Manager's office will contact him.

Ms. Allyn Marzulla, 5381 Brooklands Drive, member of the Architectural & Historic Board of Review (AHBR), commented regarding Ordinance No. 16-57, entitled "An Ordinance Amending Chapters 1202, "Administrative and Review Roles," 1203 "Development Review and Administrative Procedures," 1205, "Zoning Districts," 1207, "Zoning Development and Site Plan Standards," and 1213, "Definitions," of the Land Development Code (LDC) to Implement the Amendments to the Charter of the City of Hudson Adopted in 2015," and the motion before Council (#16-0085) to extend Planning Commission(PC)'s review period for the Ordinance. Referring to staff's report to PC, she said that the proposed LDC text amendments are different and expanded from the

Charter amendments that voters approved in November 2015 and would greatly change the responsibilities of AHBR and PC. She asked that AHBR be given an opportunity to formally review the proposed amendments.

Mayor Basil noted an earlier comment made by Mr. Sutton in which he characterized public hearings as theatrics. He assured citizens that Council deliberations are not now nor have they ever been such, and that Council discussions are serious.

With approval of this request, the Planning Commission will provide a recommendation to City Council no later than the Planning Commission's October 10, 2016, meeting. Council will conduct its own public hearing and will take final action after it receives Planning Commission's recommendation.

He said that the Planning Commission will review development plans for the new site on September 12, 2016. He said that some neighbors have expressed concerns regarding the operation of a bus garage close to their homes, including lighting, noise and fumes. Discussion followed regarding plans to raise the existing house on the property, plans for a parcel split, basic needs for the bus garage, preliminary layout, stormwater challenges, mitigation efforts, and construction management.

Proposed Amended Version (8-16-2016)

In addition, the following topics were discussed: projected General Fund revenue and other sources for funding connectivity, capital improvements, and infrastructure projects; sunsetting the proposed income tax credit; efforts to educate voters; and the effects of the State's elimination of the Estate Tax and substantial reductions to Local Government Fund revenues.
