Purpose & Explanation

The City has conducted a number of smaller individual studies following the 2003 flood, which improved several areas along the Brandywine Creek and Brandywine Creek Tributary Watershed, but no all-encompassing study has been performed of the entire watershed. In order to design cost effective solutions to the watershed in the future, this watershed study is recommended by staff in order to successfully perform these analysis and design projects that will have the most impact to the watershed.

Timing Considerations

With the concurrence of Council, staff is requesting an appropriation in the amount of \$150,000 to perform an engineering analysis of the Brandywine Creek & Tributary Watershed Study.
