Executive Summary: The purpose of the Fire Prevention & Safety Grant Program is to enhance the safety of the public and firefighters with respect to fire and fire-related hazards by assisting fire prevention programs and supporting firefighter health and safety research and development.

Legislative History

Purpose & Explanation

Staff seeks authorization to apply for a Fire Prevention & Safety Grant to implement a fire prevention program aimed at the at-risk senior citizen population. The program would include installation of residential key security boxes and hearing impaired smoke detectors in 100 homes. The grant could fund up to approximately \$51,000 requiring a 5% match (approximately \$2,550).
