

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT WITH VETRO, INC. FOR FIBER MAPPING SOFTWARE; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, for several years, the City has utilized the VETRO platform for fiber mapping software and related services to support Velocity Broadband's planning, design, and asset management efforts; and

WHEREAS, the City administration have found VETRO, Inc. to be the industry leader and while staff have evaluated alternative solutions, no other vendor has demonstrated the ability to match the services, functionality and capabilities currently provided by VETRO; and

WHEREAS, the City administration recommends updating its agreement with VETRO, Inc. for its GIS-based fiber mapping platform from the current one-year agreement to a three-year agreement; and

WHEREAS, the proposed agreement is a professional services contract, has a total value of \$46,500 over the three years, and maintains the current annual rate of \$15,500 for the duration of the proposed term; and

WHEREAS, the agreement is in the best interests of the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter a contract with VETRO, Inc. for professional services and the Vetro Fiber Mapping software. The contract shall be for three years, in an amount not to exceed Forty-Six Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars and 00/100 (\$46,500), and in a form approved by the City Solicitor.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code

Section 4. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of life, property, public health, safety, public peace, and the general welfare of the City and for the further reason that it is immediately necessary to enter this agreement in a timely fashion due to market and offer conditions, and that it affects the health, property and public peace in that such services directly help in avoiding inadvertent excavation-related utility strike involving a natural gas or other utility line; wherefore, this legislation shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage, provided it receives five (5) affirmative votes of members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes are required if all members are present; otherwise it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
