A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO A CONTRACT FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE RAVENNA STREET STORM WATER MANAGEMENT POND PROJECT WITH THE LOWEST AND BEST BIDDER.

WHEREAS, this project involves modifying and enlarging two (2) existing ponds located at 2217 Ravenna Street, owned by the City of Hudson, to provide greater stormwater storage to mitigate flooding to downstream properties along Ravenna Street;

WHEREAS, the City's consultant has finished its design of proposed storm water pond and improvements at the City's property located at 2217 Ravenna Street; and

WHEREAS, the City staff seeks to modify two (2) existing, wet ponds on the property into a single larger, dry pond; and

WHEREAS, the project will also provide additional storm water storage to alleviate flooding to downstream properties; and

WHEREAS, the pond improvements are being constructed in a manner that will leave the northerly portion of the City parcel open for future construction needs; and

WHEREAS, the project's estimated cost is \$500,000 which includes a 10% contingency; and

WHEREAS, the project is scheduled for construction in the spring/summer, 2025 as weather permits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to advertise both for a period of at least once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality and for a period of three (3) consecutive weeks on the Municipal website, requesting the submission of construction bids for the purpose of seeking the lowest and best bidder for the Ravenna Street Storm Water Management Pond Project in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's office.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into and do all things necessary to implement a contract or contracts on behalf of the City in an amount up that which has been appropriated by Council, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor and the approval as to form by the City Solicitor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate at the time of bidding.

Section 3. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.

- <u>Section 4</u>. The aforesaid project is in the City and its residents' best interest.
- <u>Section 5</u>. The above recitals are fully incorporated as findings herein.

Section 6. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 7. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
