

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ADVERTISE FOR COMPETITIVE BIDS AND TO ENTER INTO CONTRACT FOR THE W. STREETSBORO STREET SIDEWALK INSTALLATION PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, this project includes the installation of a new sidewalk along W. Streetsboro Street (SR 303) from Nicholson Drive to W. Case Drive to be installed after the SR 303 Water Transmission Line Replacement Project is completed; and

WHEREAS, this sidewalk project will be designed by in-house staff and will include the installation of a 5-foot-wide concrete sidewalk along SR 303 between Nicholson Drive and W. Case Drive, and includes related storm drainage improvements, grading, crosswalks, lighting, electric conduits, driveways, and minor clearing and restoration; and

WHEREAS, although originally scheduled for 2024, moving the bid to 2023 and bidding this project concurrently with the SR 303 Waterline Transmission Line Replacement project later this summer will result in an overall cost savings; and

WHEREAS, the Engineers estimated total cost of construction is \$817,000 which includes a 10% contingency.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, County of Summit, State of Ohio, that:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to advertise both for a period of at least once a week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation within the municipality and for a period of three (3) consecutive weeks on the Municipal website, requesting the submission of construction bids for the purpose of seeking the lowest and best bidder for the W. Streetsboro Sidewalk Installation Project in accordance with the specifications as supplied by the City Engineer's office.

Section 2. The City Manager is authorized to enter into a contract or contracts on behalf of the City in an amount to be appropriated by Council, subject to the affixing to the contract by the Finance Director of a certificate of availability of funds therefor, with the lowest and best bidder after receipt of such bids to the extent that such bid is not ten percent (10%) in excess of the Engineer's estimate at the time of bidding.

Section 3. The City Manager is authorized to add a 10% contingency amount to the contract with lowest and best bidder, of which the total contract price including any contingency amounts shall not exceed Eight Hundred Seventeen Thousand Dollars (\$817,000.00).

Section 4. The City Manager is further authorized to return all certified checks and bid bonds submitted by the unsuccessful bidders and to reject all bids for said contract if deemed necessary to do so.

Section 5. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 6. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City, and for the further reason that the City intends to bid the project in conjunction with the State Route 303 Water Transmission Line Replacement Project; wherefore, this Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage provided it receives the affirmative vote of five (5) members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes shall be required if all members are present at the meeting at which it is passed; otherwise, it shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
