The outflow, storm-5040 36" to Bauley Dr doesn't seem to be able to handle all three inputs in an extended heavy rain

Water overflowing sump pumps in basement.	2204 olde farm lane. In the basement.	Just during the big storm the previous summer.	No
July 2003 - Basement had 5 feet of water; 2024 - 2.5 feet of water (we left the pumps on this time). A river of water surrounded the house and rushed down Lascala. I have video. I stood at the end of my driveway in 2 feet of water.	7301 Lascala Dr	I noticed rushing water in our ditches the afternoon around 5 pm of Aug. 8 2024 and knew it was going to flash flood which it did around 8 pm. The drainage in the Country Club Estates neighborhood needs replaced, We have a large hole in our front yard where the pipes collapsed. I believe construction in the early 2000's near route 91 in Twinsburg is partially to blame. It was easier to send the ground water downstream than to drain it to streams to the east or west.	I have video I'd be happy to share plus damage photos and video. The first flood in 2003 cost us \$100K to replace the finished basement. The second flood in 2024 was about \$50K. The collapsed drainage in our front yard has been reported to the City at least twice. We have snow makers in the front yard denoting the location. Gary Weber 330-819-2019 or Jill Weber 330-819-2018.
We had 6 inches of water in 2003, 1 week before we had over two feet of water in our basement during the "100 year flood" in 2003. Then 6-8 inches in August of 2024. We had water from the road all the way up to our mulch line in the front yard and all the culverts were backed up from N Marblehead down Middleton. The water was coming over the two retentions ponds behind our house and on to the roads instead of where it should be flowing. Every time there is heavy rain we hold our breath for the basement because the yard, culverts, ponds all can't sustain the water and we are caught in the middle of it.	7404 N Marblehead Rd. Water in yard and basement	2190 Benjamin Circle	Basement flooded August 8, 2024. Backyard and side yard flood after every rain since.	Yes, I have a video of the 8/8 flooding in my yard. AMS just completed a project on Benjamin Circle. I am hopeful that will help with the drainage issues at my home, but am wondering if a similar project can be completed on my property. I have a work order request in with the city for trenching, but I'm told that waitlist is years long. My neighbor and I also contacted the city recommended Vizmeg to have drainage issues addressed, but never received a quote.

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Immediately behind our home is a drainage ditch the runs the length of the street (Woodspring Lane and Hudson Park Drive). Since moving into the home in 2017, increasing amounts of water are being carried by it (most noticeable over the last several years). As a direct result, the ditch is continuing to widen and deepen and washing out our backyard and potentially threatening trees. When we moved in, the ditch was approximately 2x2 feet. It's now at least 6x8 feet and this is a conservative estimate. These are concerns that my neighbors share and several have had flooding in their basements.	7521 Woodspring Lane, Hudson. Stormwater from Easthaven lots breached the berm and came over to Ellsworth Hill Dr. Years ago the city ran a camera down the catchbasin on our street (Ellsworth Hill Dr). The drain line to Stow Rd. was reported to be collapsed and broken. No repairs were ever done. We also got water in our basement during the flood of 2003. Water in basement (storm in early 2000's) Erosion along creek immediately to the west of our property following periods of rain	72 Brandywine Dr	Creek erosion following rain storms and further Impacted by the redirection of the creek when homes were built and other upstream modifications performed on the creek in the last 10-15 years that have resulted in further damage to the creek along my property line. Yard	7800 Ranett Avenue. Water surrounded the house on night of the flood approximately 5 inches up onto parts of the outside of the home. This water came directly as a result of too much water from the drainage ditch at the back of my yard and it eventually flowed around my house to the front down to Ranett Avenue. The water drainage ditch has too much water running in it already. Many smaller storms it is almost full and all the way to the top.	The flood that is being investigated is what I am discussing.
