

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO ENTER INTO A PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT WITH CHAGRIN VALLEY ENGINEERING, LTD. FOR THE DESIGN OF THE DARROW ROAD PARK STORM WATER MANAGEMENT POND, PHASE 1.

WHEREAS, the Tinkers Creek Watershed Study has proposed the development of a new storm water management pond inside Darrow Park to help alleviate flood flows to downstream properties off Tamarisk and Lascala Drive; and

WHEREAS, City staff requested qualification proposals from various engineering design firms and after a thorough review of the proposals by the City, staff is recommending Chagrin Valley Engineering to design of a new storm water management pond; and

WHEREAS, more specifically, the City Engineering Department sent out requests for proposals and four firms responded, which were generally as follows:

<u>Chagrin Valley Engineering</u>	<u>\$115,796.00</u>
GPD Group	\$139,050.32
Osborn Engineering	\$142,057.00
ms Consultants	\$204,124.00

WHEREAS, other “if-authorized” items were included in the proposal, including geotechnical, bidding assistance and construction administration, for a total of \$7,711.00; and

WHEREAS, as with other professional services contracts, City staff is requesting a 10% contingency to handle any minor changes in the scope of services that may occur during the course of the final study development; and

WHEREAS, for this contract, the 10% amount would be \$12,350.70, for a total contract of \$135,857.70.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, as follows:

Section 1. The City Manager is authorized to enter a professional services contract with Chagrin Valley Engineering for design services for the Darrow Road Park Storm Water Management Pond, Phase 1. The contract shall be in an amount not to exceed One Hundred and Thirty Five Thousand Eight Hundred and Fifty Seven Dollars and 70/100 (\$135,857.70), which includes 10% contingency, and shall be in a form approved by the City Solicitor.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution shall take effect and be in force from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
