

A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 26-8 TO INCREASE FUNDING FOR THE FRANKLIN STREET WATERLINE PROJECT; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, previously, this Council authorized advertisements and bid awards for the replacement of the waterline along Franklin Street between Aurora Street and the Hudson Middle School; and

WHEREAS, bids for the waterline project were received on May 19, 2026, with the lowest bid submitted by SiteWorx Unlimited at \$264,470.00, well above the City Engineer's estimate of \$249,950; and

WHEREAS, in order to allow for 10% contingency to handle unforeseen circumstances, City staff is requesting an additional \$17,051.00 in approved funding, bringing the total project budget to \$290,917.00; and

WHEREAS, the waterline project and the increase in funding are in the best interest of the City and its residents.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the City of Hudson, Summit County, Ohio, as follows:

Section 1. That Resolution No. 26-8 is hereby amended to allow an increase of \$17,051.00 in additional approved funding for the Franklin Street Waterline Project.

Section 2. That the aforesaid recitals are rendered to be the findings of this Council and are hereby incorporated into this Resolution.

Section 3. It is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Resolution were adopted in an open meeting of this Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

Section 4. This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of life, property, public health, safety, public peace, and the general welfare of the City, to meet federal and state project schedule requirements, and for the further reason that construction is proceeding when weather permits and time is therefore of the essence; wherefore, this legislation shall take effect and be in force immediately upon its passage, provided it receives five (5) affirmative votes of members of Council, except that six (6) affirmative votes are required if all members are present; otherwise it shall be in full force and effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.
